

## Stobie Pole Art - Working on Council Land Terms and Conditions

- 1. The Applicant must obtain written approval from SA Power Networks (SAPN) prior to completing the <u>Stobie Pole Art Working on Council Land Application Form.</u>
- The Stobie Pole Art in the Community program is managed by SAPN.Conditions set by SAPN are subject to change without Council's knowledge.
- 3. The applicant will ensure that any stobie pole painting does not unduly interfere with or cause damage to or in any way affect the property of any other person or Council.
- 4. The applicant will ensure compliance with any direction given by any applicable Authority when painting a stobie pole on Council land.
- 5. The applicant will ensure not to place any fixture or equipment on, across, under or over the road or footpath without the Authorisation of Council.
- 6. The City of Burnside reserves the right to remove artwork at its discretion (subject to approval or otherwise of SAPN).
- 7. The applicant will ensure not to impede or impact the road, footpath, or verge, with any fixture or equipment which could cause a hazard, without the authorisation of Council
- 8. Applicants are recommended to utilise the <u>consultation letter template</u> available on the City of Burnside's website to assist with consulting residents directly adjacent the proposed stobie pole site prior to commencement to gain their approval to paint.
- 9. Applicants are encouraged to contact their local <u>Ward Councillor</u> to inform them of the initiative.
