

## **Claret Ash**

## Fraxinus oxycarpa 'Raywoodii'

This tall, broad tree was bred by a South Australian nurseryman in the early 1900s. The species is is well adapted to the Adelaide plains. Free of pests and diseases, under normal conditions it will develop into a well balanced, broad-domed tree. It is well-known for its claret-coloured autumn foliage.

Height: 10-15 metres
