



Tree Species Fact Sheet

Claret Ash

Fraxinus oxycarpa 'Raywoodii'

This tall, broad tree was bred by a South Australian nurseryman in the early 1900s. The species is well adapted to the Adelaide plains. Free of pests and diseases, under normal conditions it will develop into a well balanced, broad-domed tree. It is well-known for its claret-coloured autumn foliage.






Height: 10-15 metres

Crown Spread: 15-20 metres

Type: Large street or reserve tree

Origin: Cultivar originates in South Australia

Evergreen/Deciduous: Deciduous

-  **Flowers:** Nondescript
-  **Bark:** Grey/brown
-  **Fruit pod:** Winged seed pod
-  **Foliage:** Dark green and glossy
-  **Autumn foliage:** Claret red/bronze
