



Tree Species Fact Sheet

Manchurian Pear

Pyrus ussuriensis

The foliage of the Manchurian Pear is a lustrous, dark green colour that changes to a bronze-orange in autumn. Its thick, stout trunk supports a dense crown. It responds well to additional water in the later months of summer. White flowers are borne in early spring, with a round, pea-sized berry in late summer.






Height: 10 metres

Crown Spread: 8 metres

Type: Hardy medium sized tree

Origin: Northeast Asia

-  **Bark:** Light brown/grey
-  **Fruit pod:** Small pea sized
-  **Foliage:** Glossy green
-  **Autumn foliage:** Bronze/copper
