Located in the South Eastern corner of Adelaide and just 10 minutes from the Central Business District, the City of Burnside is an ideal location for your wedding.

Hazelwood Park

Corner of Greenhill Road and Howard Terrace, Hazelwood Park

Hazelwood Park is one of the City of Burnside's most requested parks for weddings. Offering picturesque views, large grassed areas and plenty of shade, Hazelwood Park is the ideal place to pledge your commitment.

Ample car parking and a beautiful cobble stone landscaped area overlooking the natural pond provides a great location for a wedding ceremony, or photo opportunity.



- Bill Pots Memorial Garden and Duck Pond (south) - Maximum 50 guests
- Old Tree Log and Duck Pond (north)
 Maximum 150 guests

Facilities:

- Public toilets
- BBQ and picnic areas with log tables
- Parking for 80+ cars, and street parking on Davenport Terrace
- Wheelchair accessible

Features:

- Spacious grassed areas.
- Hazelwood Park War Memorial Pavilion, including the Memorial Avenue of Gum Trees.
- Bridge crossing a creek that leads to a duck-filled pond.
- Cobble stone paved area surrounded by open spaces and park landscaping.
- Rock island landscaping.
- Children's playground.
- Swimming centre in the summer months.

Travel east along Greenhill Road, continue past Portrush Road and Tusmore Avenue and turn left onto Howard Terrace. Car park entry is on Davenport Terrace.

Kensington Gardens Reserve

The Parade, Kensington Gardens

Home to a range of sporting and social clubs, Kensington Gardens Reserve is the Council's largest recreation area.

Large grassed open spaces and smaller tree-lined spaces provide striking mixture of sunlight and shaded areas, giving an abundance of wedding ceremony and photography options.

Location:

- Main grassed area north of Playground
- Maximum 150 guests

- Public toilets
- BBQ and picnic areas
- Parking for 100+ cars on South, East and West Terraces
- Wheelchair accessible
- Kensington Gardens Bowling and Tennis Club Inc
- East Torrens Kensington Gardens Hard-court Tennis Club
- Kensington District Cricket Club
- Burnside Rugby Union Football Club
- Kensington Gardens Pre-school

Features:

- Burnside Adventure Park
- Hard-court tennis courts
- Grass tennis courts
- Cricket nets
- Grassed ovals
- Creek with bird-life

Travel east along The Parade, continue past Portrush Road and Glynburn Road and turn left onto West Terrace.



Tusmore Park

Stirling Street, Tusmore

One of the Council's larger open spaces, Tusmore Park offers a combination of beautiful scenery and leisure activity.

A large grassed area at the park's gate entrance provides an ideal location for a wedding ceremony. Further into the park, a wooden and Cobblestone Bridge allow for scenic wedding photo opportunities.

Due to the children's play areas, tennis courts and wading pool, Tusmore Park is a popular destination for residents in the summer months.

Location:

Maximum 100 guests

Facilities:

- Public toilets
- BBQ and picnic areas with tables
- Wheelchair accessible
- Five full-size tennis courts
- Parking for 20+ cars off Kennaway Street, and street parking on Stirling Street and Rivington Road

Features:


- Spacious grass areas
- Wooden and cobble stone bridge crossing a creek
- Wide gravel pathway at the park entrance
- Tusmore Gate
- Children's play area
- Children's wading pool in the summer months

Travel east along Greenhill Road, turn left onto Portrush Road and turn right onto Stirling Street.





Fergusson Square

Fergusson Square, Toorak Gardens

Named after the Fergusson family and developed by Mrs Ivy Laver shortly after World War 1, Fergusson Square offers a visually stunning scene in one of the Council's most peaceful locations.

The shaded rotunda in the middle of the square surrounded by sunny grassed areas provides a great location for an intimate wedding ceremony. The colourful gardens surrounding the square provide ideal photo opportunities for those who wish to capture nature's enigmatic beauty.

Location:

Maximum 50 guests

Facilities:

 Street parking on all four roads surrounding the square

Features:

- Flower gardens on each side of the square
- Large trees offering shaded areas
- Grassed areas with ample sunlight
- Recently refurbished rotunda
- Paved, tree-lined paths leading from each corner of the square to a Wisteria-covered rotunda in the centre during Spring
- · Children's playground

Travel east along Greenhill Road, continue past Fullarton Road, turn left onto Warwick Street and take a diagonal right onto Raymond Walk.



Austral Park

Park Crescent, Linden Park

The beautiful Austral Park is situated in the quiet suburb of Linden Park.

The stunning central garden full of flowers in bloom is a gorgeous back drop for your ceremony and photographs.

Location:

Maximum 50 Guests

Facilities:

• Public Benches

Features:

- Grassed Areas
- Beautiful central, circular rose gardens
- Paved Paths
- Street parking available on all three streets surrounding the park

Travel north along Portrush Road, turn right onto Torrens Street, and turn left onto Austral Avenue until you reach Park Crescent.



Hubbe Court (Photos only)

Hubbe Court, Burnside

One of the Council's hidden gems; Hubbe Court offers a charming atmosphere and an intimate setting.

Limited parking capacity means this space is best used for photo opportunities only.

The deep green grassed area, leading to a paved area towards the back of the park and a breathtaking Morton Bay Fig tree at the front of the park, provide many opportunities for beautiful and creative wedding photographs.

Location:

Maximum capacity - Wedding party

Facilities:

 Parking for four cars, and street parking on Hubbe Court and along Lockwood Road

Features:

- Large Morton Bay Fig tree
- Shaded grassed area
- Winding pathway spanning the entire space
- Wooden bridge crossing a creek

Travel east along Greenhill Road, continue past Portrush Road and Glynburn Road, turn left onto Lockwood Road and turn right onto Hubbe Court.
